The curriculum at Swing Gate

Sustainable development is 'development that meets the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs" Brundtland Commission 1987.

Education for sustainable development (ESD) is a vision of education that empowers people to take responsibility for creating a sustainable future.





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The following Key Concepts are high profile in our curriculum and weave their way throughout learning. They are the outcomes of work by John Burden. We have been using these for some years. The questions posed are examples of how we approach topic work at Swing Gate. Recently we have been looking at key concepts alongside learning about British values, which alongside the revised curriculum have become statutory since September.

These include coverage of **Democracy** e.g choosing school council members, participating in the "send a friend to school project", links to local MP's who visit the school and speak to pupils. Rule of Law - at Swing Gate, this includes the school behaviour policy - all the school community are aware of the policy and it is understood and followed, parent/carers questionnaires relating to behaviour, safety etc. (parent survey results are on the school website). Mutual respect - this includes social, emotional aspects of learning (SEAL) taught across the school as part of the PHSCE curriculum, RE curriculum, Parent forum and anti-bullying week. Personal responsibility and liberty Home / school agreements, pupils' roles in school, school values etc. Tolerance of Culture, Faith and others. This includes RE curriculum. Links with other schools, Equalities policy and teaching and learning policy, visits to special places of worship of all faiths, visitors from different faiths to school, festival assembly celebrations e.g Harvest at Swing Gate, understanding of British values sits well with our coverage of Key concepts.


The children are working really hard to learn their Christmas presentation words and songs. We are really looking forward to
