
SWING GATE INFANT SCHOOL AND NURSERY

Information letter

Dear Parents / carers



As it is the start of a new school year and lots of new children have joined us, I thought it would be a good time to tell you a little bit about our approach to "behaviour "at Swing Gate so here we go-

- Each class within Key Stage 1 has a "feelings board" Children are encouraged to indicate whether they feel happy, cross, worried, etc. Adults within the class follow up any child who has indicated they are worried etc. and support them in talking about their feelings. If appropriate, these conversations would be discussed with parents.
- When we talk to our children through the school council, and hold pupil voice conversations, our children have told us they feel safe and confident within school.
- Each class is given lots of opportunities
 to talk about and explore relationships,
 making friends and many other topics
 within our Personal, Health, Social and
 Emotional area of the curriculum (PHSE).
 One aspect of this is Circle time when all
 children are encouraged to express
 opinions and feelings about different
 topics.
- Golden rules are up in each classroom and outside and are supported by

- opportunities for children to "shine "during the day, e.g displaying really kind behaviour to another child etc. There is a heavy emphasis on the value of verbal praise. On the flip side there are consistent sanctions in place for those who disturb teaching and learning, or hurt others deliberately. These progress through levels as described in our policy and are the same in all classes, going from a warning through time out to a situation where parents may be called in. The ultimate sanction being exclusion an extremely rare occurrence.
- Isolated incidents of unkind behaviour, verbal or physical have been dealt with according to school policy. These have been few. We always work with children to show them ways in which they may change their behaviour and always try to give them strategies for positive play.
- Playtime rules mirror those Golden rules applied inside. These are upheld by all staff. Midday supervisors periodically undertake training courses which support their interaction with children.
- Our children may receive stickers at times for brilliant behaviour etc but we do heavily emphasise the value of verbal praise.
- I am really pleased to say there were no reports of Bullying for the academic year of 14-15. The definition of bullying can be found in our anti bullying policy which is contained within our behaviour policy. It is not a word we use lightly in school.
- Achievement trees are up in all classes.
 Children may be given a leaf to put on the







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tree (or equivalent) as recognition for achievement in any area of the curriculum including behaviour.

During the week 16-20th November, we will be holding a TALK, LISTEN CARE week. This fits into our Personal social health and emotional topics - GETTING ON AND FALLING OUT.

I have attached the school behaviour policy which contains our anti bullying policy, and the Good behaviour book which is always issued to families when children start their learning journey with us.

Please take the opportunity to talk about the book with your children.
