Mathematics

This year we have been working with the National Centre for Excellence in the Teaching of Mathematics (NCETM) to further develop staff knowledge of the mastery approach to teaching. Teaching for mastery focuses on building deep conceptual understanding and spending time developing secure foundations that children can continue to build on throughout their education. If children are able to recall key number facts they will then be able to apply this knowledge to work with larger numbers and to reason and solve problems.

Concepts are introduced using the Concrete Pictorial Abstract (CPA) approach. This involves introducing children to concepts using concrete objects and pictorial representations before moving to abstract calculations and problems. Building or drawing a model makes it easier for children to visualise difficult abstract concepts.

We have been inspired by our work with the NCETM and believe it has had a positive impact on the teaching of mathematics in school. We want every child to enjoy and succeed in mathematics and look forward to continuing our journey to becoming mastery specialists. If you have any questions about mastery teaching in mathematics please ask your class teacher or the Mathematics leads (Miss Parry and Mrs Marshall).

Research shows that children are increasingly finding it hard to hold pens and pencils because of an excessive use of technology. Senior paediatric doctors have warned that an over use of touchscreen phones and tablets is preventing children's finger muscles developing sufficiently to enable them to hold a pencil correctly.

"Children are not coming into school with the hand strength and dexterity they had 10 years ago" said Dr Sally Payne, head paediatric occupational therapist NHS trust.
