Academisation Update

Following the communication dated 5th July 2019, we have received a limited number of questions from parents, which can be summarised as follows:

Will the Chiltern Educational Trust go ahead without Ashlyns?

Ashlyns' decision means that the formation of the Chiltern Educational Trust cannot proceed as planned. We are sure that parents will understand the importance of us now taking time to reflect properly on this significant development and consider our future options. There will be no change to the day-to-day experience of children and families at our school in the coming months and we remain committed to collaborative working between local schools for the benefit of all children in the town.

Why has Ashlyns withdrawn from the academisation process?

We asked Ashlyns to provide a written statement of their reasons for us to share with parents and carers. Their response was as follows: "Governors made the decision to withdraw from the process to academise and remain as a maintained, Foundation School after extensive and careful deliberations. As a result, we have chosen to retain the status quo, where all schools currently provide a high quality education and excellent care for children. We would like to assure you we remain committed to maintaining, developing, collaborative working between all the town's schools for the benefit of all local children." Ashlyns have declined to share the specific reasons behind their decision.



Parking

There is now parking available to Swing Gate parents in the car park of the Old Mill pub. The new manager has now taken over and has agreed to support the school by helping parents find safe places to park. A 'no parking' sign was previously erected by the interim manager, however, this will be taken down shortly. We hope that many of you will be able to make use of this car park in September.
