STEPS Therapeutic Behaviour Approach

We continue to follow the STEPS therapeutic behaviour approach where our main focus is to provide all children with prosocial experiences in order to have a positive impact on behaviour. We believe in teaching children how to behave in the same way we teach children to learn all other subjects.

Myself and Miss Oliver are STEPS tutors and deliver training sessions to staff in school. All staff have now been fully trained to deliver the STEPS approach and we have noticed a positive impact throughout the school. We will soon be offering parent sessions, where we will be giving further information on approach, one afternoon and one evening. The dates will be Thursday 12th March at 2pm and Thursday 19th March at 7pm.

The behaviour policy is on the school website under the statutory section.

Living Eggs

The Year 1 children thoroughly enjoyed the experience of having the living eggs in school. They arrived in an incubator and then two days later the first egg hatched. All ten eggs hatched successfully and were healthy chicks. The children spent time observing the chicks as they changed and grew. The English focus was on non-fiction texts and the children also made their own fact books.



The chicks were then taken to their new home on a small holding through a link with one of our families.

Well Being in Action

This January we launched the Wellbeing in Action project. There have already been newsletters, recipe ideas and a Big Soup share. It is part of our continued commitment to physical health, mental wellbeing and health and nutrition.

In Rabbits Class last week we piloted 'leaning buddies' where Foxes Class spent the afternoon in Rabbits Class. Children worked alongside a buddy in a variety of activities, including crafting, social games and reading. We will be giving all children in Reception to Year 2 regular opportunities to take part in these Wellbeing sessions.
