Reopening of School

We were delighted to hear that we are able to welcome all our children back to school on Monday the 8th March. A letter with full details has been sent by email to all our families today. Please be reassured that we will fully support all of the children to ensure as smooth a transition back to school as possible.

If you wish your child's work to be marked next week, it will need to be submitted by 3pm on Thursday. The teachers will not be marking on Friday in preparation for the reopening of school on Monday 8th.

School Gateway

We have made the move to Schcolgateway

using School Gateway, replacing ParentMail and WisePay for communicating with you. We also recommend you download the School Gateway app as this will then give you access to using the payment system for uniform, Breakfast Club, non-school uniform days, class trips etc. You will also receive text messages of any urgent updates we may issue. 

Wellbeing in Action

Visualise your safe place - to feel grounded



Where are your

favourite soothing places in nature? You can visit them anytime in your mind. You could write a journey to your calm safe place, describing with all your senses how it feels to be there.

Mindfulness

150ml milk

Carrot and cheddar soup Ingredients 25g butter 1 small onion, chopped 500g carrots, chopped

1 medium potato, (about 140g/5oz peeled weight), chopped 1.2l chicken or vegetable stock 100g mature cheddar, grated



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Serve with toast soldiers

Method

1) Melt the butter in a large saucepan over a low heat and tip in the onion, carrots and potato. Fry gently for about 10 mins, stirring from time to time, until the onion is soft and the vegetables are glistening.

2) Pour in the stock and bring to the boil, then reduce the heat and partially cover the pan. Simmer for about 20 minutes, until the vegetables are soft.

3) Whizz the mixture in a food processor or blender until smooth, then add the cheese and whizz again. Return the soup to the pan, pour in the milk, then reheat gently. Serve the soup with buttered toast soldiers.

Thank you to Ahmad in Foxes for sharing this recipe for Sablé biscuit aka Algerian jammy dodgers

Ingredients:

- 250g margarine or butter
- 150g icing sugar
- approx. 450g plain flour
- 1 egg yolk
- 1tsp vanilla sugar or essence
- pinch baking powder
- lemon zest
- strawberry jam, or just your favourite one! You will also need:

Biscuit cutters, you can be creative and use what you have in the cupboard. Maybe use a bottle lid to make the hole in the middle! Method:

1) Mix the margarine/butter and icing sugar in a bowl until there are no lumps. Add the egg yolk and the lemon zest and mix again. Then add the baking powder and vanilla with half the flour, then slowly add the rest until incorporated. Cling film the dough and put into the fridge for at least 30 minutes. Biscuit dough needs to be kept cold and not over worked. 2) Lightly dust your work surface, take a small piece of dough and roll out. Cut your shapes and place on your lined tray.

3) Bake at 180C for approx 8 minutes. They should be the colour as in the picture. They will still feel soft, but will crisp up.

4) Repeat the process until your dough is finished. Leave the biscuits to cool and then add a small teaspoon of jam before sandwiching the pieces together. Leave to set for a few hours.
