Attendance

Hopefully all families have had a chance to read the welcome letter sent by Mrs Gallagher and Mrs Crane, Chair of Governors that informed you about the

importance that schools put on attendance and punctuality.

All schools are judged by Ofsted using grade descriptors, attendance comes under the banner of behaviour and attitudes. The behaviour and attitudes grade descriptor for a good school is: 'Pupils have high attendance, within the context of the pandemic. They come to school on time and are punctual to lessons. When this is not the case, the school takes appropriate, swift and effective action.' Anything less than this is considered requires improvement by Ofsted.

As it stated in the letter there is a strong correlation between good attendance and achievement, and we are committed that all children should achieve their potential. As parents, we value your support in ensuring your child arrives on time

Reminders

Name labels

A polite reminder that all your child's clothing and belongings should be clearly labelled with their name. We do our best to get misplaced items back to their rightful owner but without a label we are unable to help.

Parking and idling

A polite reminder to all our families to please park considerately and safely. There are a number of cars parking on the single yellow lines opposite the school gates which is neither legal nor safe. PCSO's patrol the area and you may find yourself the recipient of a parking fine.

Also please do not leave your engine idling. This creates harmful pollution that can affect our children.

Scarlet Fever

Hertfordshire County Council has asked us to let families know of the continued national increase in scarlet fever and iGAS (invasive group A streptococcal).

They would like us to raise awareness with you to remain vigilant in looking for the signs, symptoms and the actions to be taken if your child develops scarlet fever. These are include sore throat, headache, fever, nausea and vomiting. After 12 to 48 hours the characteristic red, pinhead rash develops, typically first appearing on the chest and stomach, then rapidly spreading to other parts of the body, and giving the skin a sandpaper-like texture. The scarlet rash may be harder to spot on darker skin, although the 'sandpaper' feel should be present. Patients typically have flushed cheeks and pallor around the mouth. This may be accompanied by a 'strawberry tongue'. As the child improves peeling of the skin can occur.

School Learning

Squirrels Class impressed their teachers this week by changing for PE in less than ten minutes! The children persevered with changing into their PE kits and managing buttons and zips. All were excited to go into



the hall to take part in a PE coaching session with Game On. The session focussed on ball



skills; dropping and catching and throwing and catching to a partner. Game On will be holding PE coaching sessions each week with children across the school.

The children in Voles decided to make cakes. They each had their own bowl and added the ingredients. They concentrated hard on mixing and stirring. When their mixture was ready they



spooned it into



cake cases ready to cook. They took their cakes home to eat.

Year 1 have enjoyed mark making in their art lessons and have explored the different



types of pencil and the effects they can create. 'I can't wait to buy a 6B pencil and do this at

home' Rory enthusiastically told the class. Children then explored finding their own mark makers and using paint to explore what happens with forks, sponges and even Lego! They had great fun finding out how they could paint



using paper and tissues. Mark making skills were used to sketch a natural object, where they had to look closely at all the details. 'I like the soft pencil where I can smudge' said Effie, as she intricately sketched a shell.





As part of the history topic, Year 2 have been finding out about homes built in the past. They created the foundations for their fantastic Anglo-Saxon houses. The children also visited Berkhamsted Castle to continue their learning.



It was lovely to see all the Year 2 children arriving today ready to experience Castle Day. An immersive day of learning started with a trip to Berkhamsted Castle, including a stop at the bust of William the Conqueror at Berkhamsted School, making



lavender pouches, clay pots and shields and finishing with a medieval feast fit for a king.




Queen Elizabeth II Condolence cards
