Reminders

We never like to make the newsletter a list of reminders but there has been recent recurrent issues that we wanted to make sure all our families are aware of.

Breakfast Club - You MUST book your child's place. We have to staff Breakfast Club and just one extra child can make our ratios illegal. We would never want to have to turn away an unexpected child, please make sure you book their place ahead of the session by 14:00 on the previous working day. The School Office is not manned at the weekend. If you have any issues, please contact the school office.

Reading books:

- should be in your child's book bag daily
- when you read with your child each evening, please sign their reading record, this can be a note as simple as 'read whole book or read pages 5-7'
- library books must be returned. We are working hard, aided by fantastic support from our volunteer, Lauren Wilson, to have a well-stocked library for all the children to enjoy, a new library book will not be issued until the previous one is returned to school. We will be handing out reminder slips.

Water bottles - do not put water bottles in your child's book bag. No matter how leak proof they claim to be. A significant number of books have been returned to school ruined this term. We will need to charge parents/carers for any damages as these are all part of the new book system that we heavily invested in at the end of last year.

Parking - We are still aware of and receiving reports of poor parking at drop off and pick up. Please be considerate to our neighbours and local businesses. Safety is paramount and we want to ensure our children can walk to school without badly parked cars making crossing roads so hazardous.

Parking is also available at The Old Mill which is a short 2 minute walk away from school with safe crossing points across London Road by The Bull pub.

Year 1 were lucky to be invited to an inter-school PE event at Sports Space on Wednesday 1st



February. We were proud

of how the children behaved and we all had a really good morning.



Year 1 also took part in a D&T activity of toast making. School smelt delicious that day!



Year 2 learnt a lot during the whole school D&T project



about making toast. They explored how toasters work. Then they surveyed their friends about how they would like their toast to be prepared, thinking about the type of bread, spread, shape and how long to toast

for. Every child made a slice of toast. They really enjoyed tasting the results of their work too! Now the children can make toast for their families at home (with a little bit of supervision!)

The children in Year 2 are also learning about the Victorians this half term. They have taken part in a school Victorian day which saw the children seated in rows and completing

activities involving the three Rs... reading, writing and arithmetic. There was minimal use of modern day equipment such as interactive whiteboards instead children had the opportunity to write on a slate board. In the



afternoon they took part in a walk to the local cemetery to find the resting place of some local people that were important in the area for various reasons, including the Countess of Bridgewater who once owned the Ashridge Estate.

SEND Parent Survey

A local group of parents are asking schools to share the following message:

'The purpose of our survey is to gather data on and understand the experiences of families and professionals within Hertfordshire regarding the lack of SEN Officers or EHCP Coordinators over the last 6 months (since July 2022). We plan to use this information to raise our concerns with Hertfordshire LA about the ongoing issues this is causing, in an attempt to effect change for Hertfordshire families and professionals.

Nippers and Netiquette

Safety Apps

You might be able to control access by using apps on your child's devices, either those that come with the device or those that you install from an app store. Some apps provide reports of what your child has searched for or browsed.

None of these controls are 100% reliable so open communication is still key. It's also important to recognise that children are entitled to some privacy themselves and you might be in danger of losing their trust if the measures that you choose feel too invasive for your child.

Wellbeing in Action

Healthy Eating Salad pots

Ingredients

- 30g cheddar cheese
- 1 small carrot
- 1/2 red pepper, deseeded

- 2 x lettuce leaves
- 4 x 15ml spoons sweetcorn.

Equipment

Chopping board, grater, plate, vegetable knife, peeler, kitchen scissors, 2 clear plastic cups.

Method

- 1. Grate the cheese.
- 2. Top, tail, peel and grate the carrot.
- 3. Snip the pepper into strips and then into small pieces.
- 4. Cut the lettuce leaves into thin strips.
- 5. Arrange the ingredients in layers in the cup.

You could add other ingredients to your salad pot:

- chopped cherry tomatoes, grapes or olives
- grated courgette
- canned tuna
- cooked prawns
- sliced ham or chicken.

Mindfulness

Why not try a movement break for when your child has been sitting for a while and is doing homework or reading. Having a movement break can help them to focus and learn. An example of this can be seen here.
