Whipsnade 700. Linked to their recent about learning African Animals they visited many animals including elephants, rhinos, lions,




meerkats, cheetahs and giraffes. A highlight was seeing two young lions come right up to the fence and prowling around.

about how lions hunt and how meerkats camouflage.



have created vibrant relief print tiles of flowers and we can't wait to see their flower collographs today!








Apps



Healthy Eating Lulu's cheese puffs

Ingredients





- 2 cups of grated cheese, any sort of hard cheese
- 1 egg beaten
- 1/2 cup of milk
- 1. Preheat oven to 180°C. Sift flour into a large bowl.
- 2. Mix in all other ingredients using a wooden spoon, adding the milk last to bind.
- 3. Mix well to ensure even combination, particularly the flour and milk - the mixture should be quite sticky.
- 4. Grease a muffin tin, or baking sheet and set aside.
- 5. Use a tablespoon to pop golf ball-sized amounts into the tin or onto the sheet.
- 6. Bake for approx. 10 minutes.
- 7. Cool in tray for five minutes then pop out separating edges of each puff with knife from tray. Serve immediately.
